

SPOKEN ENGLISH – 3 PHASES

Phase 1: Foundation

❖ Basic Vocabulary and Grammar

- Introduction to English alphabet, pronunciation, and basic greetings.
- Learn essential vocabulary related to daily routines, family, and common objects. Introduce basic grammar concepts like verb tenses (present simple, present continuous).

❖ Listening and Speaking Practice

- Listen to simple conversations and practice speaking aloud. Focus on pronunciation and fluency.
- Role-play scenarios like ordering food, asking for directions, or making phone calls. Encourage speaking in complete sentences.

❖ Reading and Writing Skills

- Start reading short passages or stories. Focus on comprehension and understanding context.

Phase 2: Intermediate

❖ Expanded Vocabulary and Advanced Grammar

- Introduce complex grammar structures (past perfect, conditional sentences). Practice through exercises and conversations.

❖ Listening Comprehension and Speaking Fluency

- Listen to podcasts, TED talks, or interviews. Focus on understanding main ideas and taking notes.
- Participate in group discussions or debates on various topics. Encourage expressing opinions and supporting arguments.

❖ Reading Comprehension and Writing Practice

- Read articles, essays, or short stories. Analyze the author's perspective and writing style.
- Practice writing essays or opinion pieces. Focus on structuring ideas logically and using cohesive devices.

Phase 3: Advanced

❖ Advanced Vocabulary and Pronunciation

- Learn idiomatic expressions, phrasal verbs, and collocations. Practice using them in context.
- Work on pronunciation and intonation through tongue twisters, accent reduction exercises, and mimicking native speakers.

❖ Public Speaking and Presentation Skills

- Prepare and deliver short speeches on various topics. Focus on organizing content, engaging the audience, and using visual aids effectively.
- Practice giving presentations on more complex topics. Incorporate storytelling techniques and persuasive language.

❖ Review and Application

- Review previously learned material. Identify areas for improvement and focus on strengthening weak skills.
- Apply language skills in real-life situations. Engage in conversations with native speakers, watch English movies without subtitles, and continue reading and writing regularly.
